COVID-19 Vaccine Update: April 20th, 2021**

The Vancouver Coastal Health vaccination campaign for frontline essential workers is continuing. Due to an unexpected reduction in vaccine availability this week, VCH has allotted the VPD a reduced number of doses that have been designated for sworn police officers only. The PWG has notified eligible members directly through their work e-mail with a link to book their appointments for this Friday to Sunday. The PWG is anticipating that next week, all remaining VPD sworn members and civilian professional staff who have not received their vaccine from this campaign will be eligible to book an appointment, however the VCH vaccine campaign is fluid and subject to unexpected changes due to vaccine availability.

Please be advised of the following important information when booking your appointment:

- **Please carefully read all of the attached documentation from Vancouver Coastal Health that was included with your invitation e-mail;**
- At the time of this e-mail, the only location available for booking an appointment for police officers in the Vancouver Coastal Health region as part of this campaign is the Vancouver Convention Centre East. Please be advised that additional locations may open throughout the week – please check back if any other locations open for appointments for this weekend;
- If you cannot attend a clinic this weekend, you will remain eligible and can book an appointment in the weeks to come;
- If you do not see any available appointments on the booking page, please continue to check back as more appointments are added whenever there is capacity;
- If you are experiencing problems with the website, try the link on your mobile device.

Direct Pharmacy Vaccination Bookings:

All staff at police and fire departments who are 40 years of age and older (born in or before 1981) can choose to receive the COVID-19 vaccine at a pharmacy rather than booking at a public clinic. To find an eligible pharmacy and book an appointment, please visit the [B.C. government website](#).

Thank you for your patience and cooperation as our vaccination program for frontline and essential workers continues. Vancouver Coastal Health is committed to our goal to offer vaccine to all police and firefighters within the coming weeks.

Each week, we will be able to invite staff from additional police and fire departments across the VCH region to clinics in their communities. Staff who were invited to a clinic last week but were unable to book an appointment right away will continue to be eligible to receive their vaccine for the duration of the program. Once invited, staff can book an appointment in the weeks to come using the booking link in the letter of invitation provided by their employer, though clinic locations and times may vary from week to week. **This letter is not transferrable. Vaccine doses have been allocated for invited staff only; if others use the link to book an appointment they will be turned away at the clinic.** If you do not see any available appointments on the booking page, please continue to check back as more appointments are added as capacity allows.

Staff at police and fire departments who are 40 years of age and older (born in or before 1981) can choose to receive the COVID-19 vaccine at a pharmacy rather than booking at a public clinic. To find an eligible pharmacy and book an appointment, please visit the [B.C. government website](#).

IMPORTANT NOTES:

- The invitation for the frontline and essential worker vaccination program is for uniformed officers and members of your staff who may have similar levels of interaction with the public.
- Appointments for this program will **NOT** be booked through the provincial booking platform or call centre.
- This vaccine is recommended for those aged 18 and up.
- Please do not attend the clinic if you are feeling unwell, experiencing COVID-like symptoms, or if you have been asked by Public Health to self-isolate.
- Come alone, to assist with COVID-19 safety protocols. Physical distancing measures will be in place throughout, including while waiting in line.
- Please bring:
 - your driver's license (or other photo ID)
 - personal health number/BC Services Card, if you have one
 - Employee ID, paystub or letter from your employer
- You will be provided with a medical mask and reminded to maintain physical distancing guidelines while at the clinic.
- After you receive your vaccination, please plan to stay on site for 15 minutes to ensure you experience no adverse effects, such as an allergic reaction.

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- Second doses will be offered 16 weeks from the first dose based on provincial and national [recommendations](#). Data from jurisdictions around the world shows one dose of vaccine provides a high level of protection.
- When it's time to receive the second dose, your staff will be invited to receive it as they were for their first dose. It is important they retain the paper record of immunization to bring back to the clinic.
- Provincial orders and guidelines remain in place for everyone, even if you have received the vaccine.
